*What is the Train-the-Trainer Option?

A Train-the-Trainer option is available as an *additional* third day for those wishing to become recognized as NTG Affiliated Regional Trainers. The NTG is developing a core group of Affiliated Regional Trainers nationally. Affiliated Regional Trainers are those individuals who have completed the two-day Dementia Capable Care of Adults with ID and Dementia training as well as the third day "Train-the-Trainer" workshop and successfully complete an online test of knowledge. Regional trainers are authorized to use the copyrighted NTG Dementia Capable Care of Adults with ID and Dementia curriculum and related materials to conduct trainings for their organization or for outside agencies and organizations on a fee for service basis. As a recognized NTG affiliated Regional Trainer you will receive NTG branded and copyrighted Power Point slides covering the topics included in the two-day training as well as additional expanded topic modules for topics not covered in the two-day workshop, a Trainer Manual, class handouts and exercises, and extensive additional resources. In addition, Regional Trainers will be assigned an NTG Master Trainer who will mentor them in the use of the curriculum. Quarterly webinars are held to keep Regional Trainers up-to-date on advances in knowledge relating to ID and dementia, new resources, and as a means of sharing ideas and success stories.
