Over **4,600** people received supports to live and work in their community

**1,671** people were employed in jobs of their choice

**271** received transportation to work

**2,157** were engaged in the community

**423** people lived independently in their own home

**1,569** families received temporary support

**90%** of individuals stated PLB funded services helped them reach their goals and become more independent
