
Our Vision for St. Louis County: Individuals of all abilities are provided with opportunities that allow them to fulfill their potential and live as respected and included members of the community

Employment Services focus on providing supports which enable individuals to successfully work in the setting of their choice.



Community Services focus on providing supports which enable individuals to successfully live in their home or the home of the natural family, and participate as members of the community.

INITIATIVES THAT MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Partnership for Hope Collaboration with DMH

Providing solutions that support 95 individuals

PfH leverages state and federal funds

Instead of 100% of the cost of services, PLB pays 20%, freeing funds to serve more people

Adaptive Equipment and **Home Modifications**

25 people received 37 pieces of equipment to help them achieve goals for safety and independence

195 items are available for loan from the Lending Library

One-time Capacity Building

\$1.8 million invested in 36 agencies for 63 projects including:

- Education and Training Expansion
- Technology Enhancements
- Capacity Building Consultations
- Equipment Upgrades

2017 IMPACT

Over 4,500 people receive supports to live and work in their community

783 people received support in sheltered employment (324 received transportation to work)

815 people received assistance in inclusive work settings (9% increase)

423 people lived independently in their own home (3% increase)



2017 ST. LOUIS COUNTY **NEEDS ASSESSMENT**

Over 13,000 surveys sent to families who receive services from DMH, SSD, or PLB

Needs exist for services that:

- Build skills for independence
- Support individuals who live with their families
- Provide self-advocacy, communication and socials skills training
- Offer a meaningful day activity
- Connect families to resources and help them navigate complex systems



1,589 families received

93% of individuals stated PLB funded services helped them reach their goals and become more independent
